Be at least a senior in high school or current student who will be enrolled full-time during August 2024 – June 2025 in one of the following: • Community college / university / graduate school • Trade / vocational school

- Submit proof of cumulative GPA of 2.5 or above for the most recent school term (whether high school, college, or vocational/trade school).
- ☐ Submit the attached application and essay responses including all items noted above by 5:00pm on **February 15, 2024**.
