2024 Nominees for Board of Directors

Vincent L. Demasi



Vincent L. Demasi has been a member of COPFCU since 1975. He was appointed to the Supervisory Committee in 2001 and Supervisory Committee Chairperson in 2014. Vince earned his Bachelor's Degree from UC and received a Master of Business Degree with a concentration in Finance from Xavier University.
